****Emancipation Proclamation: Date Signed, January 1st, 1863**

What is the Emancipation Proclamation? It is a legal document signed by President Abraham Lincoln that officially freed Black Americans from involuntary servitude (or slavery). Frederick Douglas, a famous black abolitionist from Maryland, was a well-known advisor to President Abraham Lincoln, during the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation.

****The 13th Amendment to the Constitution: Date: ratified on December 6, 1865**

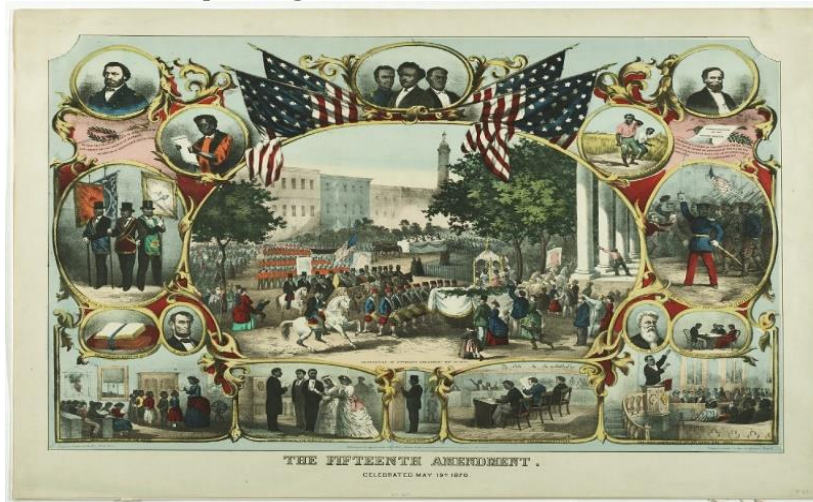
What is the 13th Amendment? According to coolkidfacts.com, *"It's one of the most famous amendments because it made slavery and involuntary servitude illegal in the United States.* At this point, many slaves had already been freed under the Emancipation Proclamation, **but the Thirteenth Amendment made their freedom permanent and freed those who were still in slavery.** "

****The 15th Amendment to the Constitution: Date: Feb. 26, 1869 ratified Feb. 3, 1870**

What is the 15th Amendment? A legal addition to the US constitution that gave **Black men** the right to vote by declaring that they could not be denied this right because of their race, color, or previous condition of servitude.

Take a close look at the central panel. It depicts the parade held in Baltimore on May 19, 1870 honoring the passing of the 15th amendment.
